Part 2: Description

Overview: This module consolidates learning undertaken at Levels 1 and 2, bringing together technical skills and environmental, health and regulatory knowledge to address the type of real-world scenarios undertaken by practitioners in professional practice.

Features: Not applicable

Educational aims: Students will engage in a range of field activities and/or simulated scenarios, enabling them to demonstrate their ability to assess environmental health risks and devise appropriate courses of action, having regard to legislative requirements, statutory and non-statutory guidance. Students will also develop their approach to systematically managing complaints, inspections and audits, and will explore theories of leadership, professional standards and ethics in the context of environmental health.

The linkages between environmental health and other professions are examined, and students will recognise the importance of partnership working in the delivery of positive public health outcomes. The module will allow students to develop their ability to appraise the efficacy of environmental health interventions, identifying innovative methods of service delivery.

Outline syllabus: Subjects taught in the module include:

Investigating and resolving complaints;

Theories of leadership in an Environmental Health context;

Professional ethics, professional codes of ethics;

The limits of own scope of practice and when to seek advice from others;

Collaboration with partner agencies to ensure effective environmental health interventions:

Improvements in order to enhance services;

Innovative professional practice.
