Educational aims: This module will primarily focus on your technical ability and on extending your responsiveness to a screen partner(s).

Outline syllabus: Exercises will focus on building your trust in instinctual behaviour, on fully listening and reacting, and on being fully spontaneous and alive in the

moment. Acting methodology will focus on Meisner inspired techniques as well as other exercises and improvisations designed to inspire and free the actor. This will allow you to develop spontaneous behaviour in order to respond to any given circumstance within a scene.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: Practical assignments include working with a director and scene partner to rehearse and effectively apply technique to film scenes from different genres, using more complex set ups and locations and requiring new technical skills.
