Part 2: Description

Overview: This module focuses on developing trainees' evidence-based knowledge, understanding and skills in teaching and learning in the foundation subjects which make up the non-core part of the English National Curriculum for primary education.

Educational Aims: Develop trainees' critical, evidence-based understanding of the application of a range of theories and effective practices in learning and teaching Primary Foundation Subjects Support trainees to understand and apply key concepts, curriculum and pedagogical approaches in teaching Primary Foundation subjects, and to be able to plan for learners' needs and successes. Develop trainees' knowledge and understanding of the policies relating to Primary Foundation subjects curricula and teaching in England

Outline Syllabus: English National Curriculum for the Foundation subjects. Key subject knowledge for teaching foundation subjects How to teach foundation subjects in primary settings Identifying and addressing key aspects of children's learning across the foundation subjects Extending learning in foundation subjects to address the needs of all learners.

Teaching and Learning Methods: You will engage with this module through a range of tutor-directed teaching and learning approaches, peer engagement and significant independent study.

STUDENT AND ACADEMIC SERVICES

We prioritise learner agency and the development of learning skills and dispositions including research-informed questioning and debate. There is an expectation that trainees will link their academic studies to their professional development and practice throughout.

Part 3: Assessment

A portfolio provides students with the opportunity to explore 3 foundation subjects in some detail. The foundation subject they focus on must be different subjects to any that they use in the assessment in the Across the Curriculum module. The assignment should include reference to their own teaching experience as well as literature and policy. Plagiarism is addressed in that trainees are commenting on their own experience in school alongside the supporting research and policy.
