Part 2: Description

Overview: This module allows the students to consolidate their prior learnings of the programme into the production of a final screen production project.

Features: Not applicable

Educational aims: As the culmination of the course, this module offers the greatest scope for individual choice and extended independent study. It aims to enable

students to develop the skills of independent research by extending what they have learned.

Outline syllabus: This module offers the opportunity to develop a final screen production project, while receiving feedback from peers, and critique and support from a supervisor.

Workshops.

Provide opportunities for students to share their work with their cohort for peer feedback.

Projects.

Students engage with the creation of a final screen production project.

Independent Study.

This includes studio practice that allows students to gain a deeper understanding of existing skills, and acquire new ones through research activities appropriate to their developing practice.

Lectures/Screenings/Seminars.

A range of events that expose students to a range of ideas and critical debates designed to stimulate and enhance the creation and completion of their final screen production project.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: This module will be primarily delivered through independent study, supported by relevant workshops, lectures, screenings, seminars, small group tutorials, one-on-one consultations and Q & A sessions with industry professionals.

It is further supported by other online materials via Blackboard.

Independent study will consolidate the learnings from the prior modules, resulting in

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the production of a final screen production project.

One-to-one consultations provide an opportunity for a supervisor to give support and

critique.

Workshops and small group group tutorials, such as table reads or screenings, will

allow students to share works in progress, and receive peer feedback on the

progress of their final screen production project.

Lectures, seminars and screenings are intended to broaden the students' experience

of the contemporary screen industries, and deliver or demonstrate short practical

exercises that consolidate existing skills and introduce new ones.

Module Learning outcomes: On successful completion of this module students will

achieve the following learning outcomes.

MO1 Design, plan and deliver a substantial screen production project

appropriate for Masters study in the subject area of screen industries, to an

agreed schedule and deadline.

MO2 Select, evaluate and operationalise appropriate research methods and

practice processes to address the needs of the screen production project.

MO3 Successfully carry out research pertaining to the position of the screen

production project within its screen industry.

MO4 Critically analyse and draw findings from their research, presenting their

conclusions through reflective practice.

MO5 Critically reflect upon and communicate about the above research through

the medium of a proposal designed to secure funding for the further

development, exhibition or distribution of the screen production project in its

relevant screen industry.
