Teaching and learning methods: Teaching and learning methods will include a mix of synchronous webinars and meetings, with asynchronous lecture videos, readings, tasks and activities alongside independent study and tutor support.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: This module will contain two assessment tasks: a formative presentation and a summative research proposal.

Formative assessment: Presentation – students will deliver a presentation outlining research questions and data collection strategies. In the Q&A session, questions will be asked by both teaching staff and students.

Summative assessment: Research Proposal - this assignment will build on formative feedback from the presentation. The research proposal will contain a range of topics

covered in the module including: methodology, data collection and data analysis. The proposal will contain a completed research ethics form. Students will be encouraged, where appropriate, to align this proposal to their intended dissertation research.
