## Part 2: Description

This module is one of the 30 credit level two modules that students engage in prior to going out on their second professional practice placement. In this module they consider the assessments, interventions and outcome measures used when working with people with mental health conditions and/or learning disabilities. Scheduled learning opportunities include lectures, seminars, practical sessions in small groups (sizes varying due to type of activities and risk assessments) and workshops, group-work projects, some use of online resources

The syllabus will usually include:

Part 3: Assessment

#### Component A: 3000 word project essay

Students are required to write a 3000 word project essay which brings together their learning in the area of Psychosocial Challenges, and demonstrates their ability to critique the evidence and theories around the impact of these on occupation and how occupational therapy can assist.

## Rationale

A written exploration is considered the most appropriate way to demonstrate the depth and breadth of their

engagement with the literature and ability to write succinctly.

#### **Formative Assessment**

Students will be given formative feedback on their work and skills as they progress through the module, for example there are two cohort assignment briefing sessions where the content and structure of the assessment is discussed as a cohort and feedback given as part of that process.
