Part 2: Description

Overview: You will be cast and perform in one or more Student Led Productions. These will be small cast plays (so usually two to six performers in each) directed by students on the MA Directing course, as well as designed by students in the MA Design Course, who will be closely supervised by a professional director (either visiting or in-house) and working to industry protocols and standards.

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Features: The School recognises that you are the professional practitioners of the future, that there is huge benefit to working collaboratively with your peers, whilst being guided and mentored by staff or other experienced professionals. Creative relationships that develop in the Theatre School can last for many years in the industry.

These productions will be technically supported (with design, stage management, lighting, sound and costume) as appropriate. The productions will enable you, as an actor, to exercise and synthesise the skills and techniques you have learnt throughout training and develop your creative relationships.

These productions will allow you the opportunity to perform in a piece with a small cast. This opens up the range of plays available for performance, and can provide a different stylistic approach from large ensemble pieces in which you will have performed so far in your training.

Productions are rehearsed and performed under professional conditions, using usual professional protocols to prepare you for a career working in theatre and allied industries.

Educational aims: Working with others to create fully staged productions, you will be able to synthesize knowledge and experience acquired throughout the course. You will be expected to conduct yourself in a professional manner regarding creative input, research and preparation, rehearsal etiquette, time-keeping and professional relationships with others on the productions.

Outline syllabus: The preparation and rehearsal of a small cast play or plays.

Performance in a venue to a public audience and industry professionals.

The use of usual industry protocols throughout rehearsals and performance.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

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Teaching and learning methods: As with all productions, teaching and learning is primarily through doing; you will rehearse in a sustained and considered fashion,

working as part of a small company.

You will be expected to prepare for rehearsals, actively contribute in an appropriate

manner within the rehearsal room and remain sensitive to the overall style of the

piece as led by the director. The project, the director and all students working on the

production will be mentored and guided throughout.

Module Learning outcomes: On successful completion of this module students will

achieve the following learning outcomes.

production, making appropriate acting offers as you develop your role.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Formative assessment will be of both the rehearsal process

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This module will be closely monitored and mentored throughout by tutors and/or

visiting industry professionals. The students' engagement in the rehearsal and

preparation process will be assessed through this monitoring.

deliver the performance.

Rehearsals will usually be of three- or four-weeks duration.

There will normally usually be between three and six performances.
