Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: The summative assessment will be a Group presentation (20 mins, made up of 10 mins presentation and 10 mins questioning) that discusses both the influences on the development of a real-life case study project and analyses the external factors that could affect it during its lifecycle.
