Part 2: Description

Overview: The module is inspired by the wider Street Law movement which has supported the delivery of public legal education across the world since the 1970s. This module offers students opportunity to develop research, presentation and collaboration skills as well as knowledge of the law through creation of projects created and disseminated to wider public audiences.

It will also be linked to the Student Lawyer project, where students will engage in wider project work involving external engagement as well as personal and professional development activities.

Educational aims: The aim of the module is to engage students in developing research and presentation skills in the context of new areas of law which are of relevance for dissemination to a range of external audiences, drawing on the philosophy of the wider Street Law movement which supports public legal education in a variety of forms.

The module is connected to the Student Lawyer Project, which will be delivered programmatically across the year. Students will engage in two project weeks, one in each teaching semester, which will align thematically to the study of core modules. Through the projects students will extend their academic studies into wider exploration of legal themes, external engagement, and ongoing reflection on their own personal and professional development with the aim of supporting their wider development across their individual student journey.

Outline syllabus: The module syllabus will be skills based, it will involve working with different areas of law, depending on the projects chosen for each module run. Students will learn a range of skills including research; group working ; communication; collaboration; project management and time management.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: The module will be delivered through student led workshop sessions. Students will be supported to take control of their learning and to determine the course of each project, working together to determine the format, approach and audience.

It will align with the Student Lawyer Project where students will engage in wider project work which will further support their development of independent learning

skills; research; team work; time management; presentation skills and the capacity for effective reflection on their learning.

Module Learning outcomes: On successful completion of this module students will achieve the following learning outcomes.
