Part 2: Description

Overview: This module focuses on supporting students to further develop their skills, knowledge, understanding and experience of teaching and learning, applying what they have learned in their practice to the classroom. Students are supported by mentor/s in school and by a UWE Tutor. They are formatively assessed against a matrix mapped to the CCF (Core Content Framework) and relevant International Teachers' Standards at the end of an assessed practice

Educational aims: Develop students ability to demonstrate and critically evaluate a diverse range of effective, evidence-based, practices in learning and teaching to support all learners to make good progress.

Support students to apply their developed knowledge and understanding of key subject-focused concepts, curriculum and pedagogical approaches, and to be able to evaluate and plan for learners' needs and successes.

Provide students with opportunities to develop their critical understanding of child/adolescent development, diverse needs, and the contexts of learners' lives, to enable them to support learners' social, cultural, emotional and academic development.

Support students to develop effective communication skills, the ability to build respectful, positive, relationships with children and adults, and an understanding of the importance of these for effective, values-based teaching.

Support students to gain a developed understanding of the professional responsibilities of teachers and support them to apply appropriate professional skills, understandings and behaviours, identifying their ongoing development needs and how to meet these.

Facilitate students to develop and apply knowledge, understanding, skills and empathy to their own practice as reflective, creative, teachers and to be able to critically evaluate the educational impact of their pedagogic choices on learners.

Teaching and learning methods: In this module, students apply their evidence-based, experiential general and subject-specific knowledge and understanding of teaching and learning to their practice. Teaching and learning is facilitated through

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experience in the classroom supported by a mentor/s in school and a UWE Tutor

with a final assessed period of teaching against the International Teachers'

Standards.

A continual audit of subject knowledge and pedagogies will be used to create

development opportunities.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: The criteria for assessment of Professional Practice will

comply with the current, relevant professional International Core Content Framework

and International Teachers' Standards. Within this module, students must

demonstrate a developed and competent accumulation, assimilation and volume of

knowledge, understanding, skills and attitudes acquired during training.

Completion of an on-going portfolio of evidence spans the 36 -week, 30-credit

module. Evidence is added to an online platform called SWEPT that is reviewed

formatively against the Core Content Framework, throughout the course. This will

indicate progress over time whilst allowing for additional support or interventions to

be put into place where necessary- this is based on needs analysis and in

conjunction with liaising with the school mentor.

This culminates in a 6-week formally assessed practice to meet the Teachers'

Standards. At the end of this 6-week practice there is a live online Viva VoceT to

assess understanding. This, combined with the evidence portfolio, forms the

summative assessment against the Teachers' Standards on a Pass/Fail basis.

Success on this module results in recommendation for International Qualified

Teacher Status from the Department for Education.
