Part 2: Description

Overview: The Working in Teams module provides an opportunity for students to explore theories of leadership and team working. The students will complete a group activity of creating a poster, and gain experience of working in teams and linking theories learnt to practice.

Educational aims: On completion of this module the student will be able to explain the principles underpinning leadership theories and associated team-working and leadership competencies, and will demonstrate a range of those competencies, attitudes and behaviours required in clinical practice (NMC, 2018)

Outline syllabus: The indicative content of the module will focus on the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) standards (2018). Within each module in the programme, teaching and learning progressively explores the nature of care and practice, focusing on the NMC Standards of proficiency for nursing associate's platforms and annexes.

Teaching and learning methods: This module will use a variety of teaching and learning methods which may include e-learning, seminars, lectures, group work, directed and self-directed learning.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Nursing associates will be a core member of the multi-disciplinary team in a range of health and care settings.

Formative assessment: Opportunities for formative assessment will occur throughout the module, and also on the final day of the module delivery either via in-class or online methods. This will check students' knowledge of the module content. Students will have the opportunity to discuss their experiences of team working whilst in clinical practice. Students will create a poster on a specific topic, reflecting on working in teams, i.e. allocation of work, leadership styles, conflict resolution, team members roles and characteristics.

Summative assessment: A 2000 word essay that analyses and critically reflects on

the Nursing Associate experience of working in teams whilst in clinical practice, with reference to appropriate theory, to the role of the Nursing Associate.
