Reading Strategy

The focus of the dissertation will determine the reading strategy and will be unique to each dissertation and guided by the supervisor. Appropriate directed reading will be likely to be through legal databases such as Westlaw and LEXIS as well as the WWW. Given the more in-depth nature of the research substantial use of the library will be expected.

Assessment Strategy

There are three elements to the assessment:

Element 1- Personal Action Plan – in-depth plan of learning development for the dissertation to be submitted to supervisor at a fixed date in semester 1 should discuss research skills, planned development, application of relevant research methodology, development of law and outline of particular objectives. 1000 words, worth 5% of overall mark.

Element 2 - Research Plan - This should include the following:

- Presentation of appropriate outline highlighting research thesis, main issues and dissertation organisation
- Identification of appropriate research plan, methodology and sources
- Review of the literature available on the research topic identifying primary and secondary sources and evaluating their suitability for use in relation to the dissertation
- Identified sources properly referenced in a full bibliography
- Evaluation of project management demonstrating critical self awareness and supported by appropriate evidence. 2000 words worth 10% of the overall mark.

This is a more detailed plan and supervisor will give feedback, ensuring that the dissertation will achieve the objectives set out. Worth 10% of overall mark. Will be submitted by set date (three weeks from submission of Personal Action Plan).

Element 3 - Dissertation of up to 12000 words worth 85% of overall mark submitted end of semester 2
