Part A: Programme Overview, Aims and Learning Outcomes

Overview: The MSc Public Health [Hainan] is jointly delivered over 18 months by an experienced academic team from Hainan Medical University and UWE Bristol. It is based on the UK-based programme that has been delivered at UWE Bristol since 2000. It has a broad multidisciplinary curriculum designed to meet the needs and aspirations of anyone pursuing a career in public health. The curriculum draws upon the social, human, biomedical, environmental and political sciences to equip graduates with intellectual and practical skills to engage with contemporary international public health concerns. It recruits students from China, and from any discipline, and provides a stimulating, challenging, supportive and inclusive learning experience. The curriculum is mapped against international and national core competencies and skills for public health education and professional practice, and was developed in particular to align with the public health education benchmarks of the Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region (ASPHER), the Agency for Public Health Education Accreditation (APHEA), the UK Faculty of Public Health and the UK Public Health Knowledge and Skills Framework. The programme aims to provide ready and able graduates for China and the international public health workforce, consistent with the World Health Organisation's (WHO) objective to improve the health of populations and maintain pursuit of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Educational Aims: To inspire students to pursue a career in public health and feel empowered to make a significant contribution to society.

To educate students with a broad-based knowledge and critical understanding of interdisciplinary public health.

To furnish students with the intellectual and transferable skills to be able to synthesise and interrogate evidence, shape contemporary public health agendas, and undertake a lead professional role in international public health.

To equip students with the knowledge, confidence, ethical and professional integrity to work in challenging public health environments and arenas.

To prepare students for working in partnership and with diplomacy, across sectors and disciplines, and to engage with stakeholders on complex public health interventions.

To develop students' investigative, research and evaluation capabilities so that they can undertake, commission and lead health research and evaluation.

To educate students to develop an ethical mind-set that prepares them for challenging political scenarios, instilling commitment towards tackling global inequalities and promoting an ecologically sustainable world.

Part C: Higher Education Achievement Record (HEAR) Synopsis

This internationally accredited Public Health master's programme provides graduates with academic and professional knowledge and skills for employment in the international public health workforce. It equips graduates with nationally and internationally recognised skills and competencies for Public Health professional practice. These encompass applied research, evaluation and epidemiology, leadership and management, health promotion, health education and health protection, public policy and health economics. The programme embraces a socioecological, systems approach to public health, preparing students to tackle global inequalities and build sustainable communities. The programme recruits students

from all disciplinary and professional backgrounds and has an exceptional reputation for employability and student experience.

Part D: External Reference Points and Benchmarks

The programme is based on the UWE Bristol MSc Public Health programme that has evolved over more than twenty years in alignment with national and international professional benchmarks for public health. For this reason, it has a compulsory curriculum that ensures graduates meet the respective competences commensurate with professional practice. The programme strikes a balance between meeting Mlevel academic learning outcomes and professional practice benchmarks. It aligns closely with APHEA's (Agency for Public Health Education Accreditation) validation and accreditation requirements, which makes it globally relevant for the international Public Health workforce. In developing the programme, the curriculum was mapped against APHEA's international public health education benchmarks to ensure that it adheres to international standards for a modern comprehensive degree with core competences expected for professional practice. Accordingly, the curriculum include core competencies in public health research methods, population health and its determinants, health policy, health economics, public health management, public health ethics and health promotion. The curriculum was also designed to align with the educational benchmarks of ASPHER (Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region), the UK Faculty of Public Health (Public Health Specialty Training Curriculum 2015) and the UK Public Health Knowledge and Skills Framework 2016.

In terms of academic benchmarking, the MSc Public Health reflects the benchmark standards of the Quality Assurance Agency for UK Higher Education (QAA) Subject Benchmark Statement for Health Studies. While these standards are set for bachelor's degrees with honours, the MSc Public Health draws much of its syllabus content, ethos, interdisciplinary character, generic and subject specific knowledge and skills, and teaching, learning and assessment strategies from these standards, forming the foundation for M-level public health education. Furthermore, the programme is designed to meet the academic standards and quality for UK higher education (QAA UK Quality Code for Higher Education) and for European higher education (identified by the Bologna Process).

Part E: Regulations

Approved variant to University Regulations and Procedures:

- A UWE Bristol module is made up of one or more JEP course units. To pass a UWE module, a student must achieve a mark of 50% for each of the JEP course units and a mark of 50% overall.
- Until a student has passed all of the JEP course units that make up a UWE module, they will not pass the UWE module.
