Part 2: Description

Overview: In this module students will gain practical experiences making and developing location and space-specific production works, including but not limited to photography, video/sound/performance art, interactive and immersive installations.

Features: Not applicable

Educational aims: Students will develop an appreciation for the themes addressed by the "spatial event" and examine these within the context of critical practice in the

development of audience-centred engagement. Lectures will be augmented by visits to appropriate exhibitions and guest workshops led by industry and academic experts.

Outline syllabus: This module will give students practical experience in the production of media installations and will ask them to consider the role of sound, image, scale and site specificity. Key themes include photography, video/sound/performance art, interactive and immersive installations.

Students will be asked to identify and question the role of the audience in each instance and how audio/visual installations and performances communicate with different audiences through different forms. In their lectures and workshops, students will explore the histories of expanded cinema, digital installation and real-time performance and be asked to produce multimedia work of their own for a specific space.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: This module will be supported by a programme of theory-informed lectures which explore the mechanics of seeing, exclusion, inclusion and privilege, representation, image and identity, and surveillance technologies.

In practical workshop sessions, students will carry out mini projects and prepare for an end-of-module exhibition. Group critiques will be used to embed critical reflection of the student's own work from the start. In their written work, students will be expected to engage with various contemporary and historical debates within their chosen medium and how this relates to their own practice.

installation work in a specific space. The project will include a critical reflection of

their own work, informed by regular in-class, group critiques.

tutorials in which feedback will be given, for example during group discussions,

individual tutorials and workshop sessions.

The resit assessment is comparable to the first-sit with students asked to submit a

detailed site-installation plan.
