Part 2: Description

Overview: Acting for Screen introduces students to key working processes for screen performance and offers technical training in readiness for industry expectation as independent actors.

Features: Students will receive technical training on filmmaking kit for independent location filming.

They will receive pre and post production training in Storyboard design and Premiere Pro editing software.

The use of resources is in line with previous runs of a similar module and has not

for Filmmaking or other School of Arts modules.

Educational aims: By the end of the module, students will be confident and

independent actors with performance skills enabling entry into screen industries.

Outline syllabus: Students will engage with actor training techniques for camera, to

include the close-up shot, mid-shot, and practical crew etiquette/health and safety

training for location filming.

Independent actor preparation will include text and character analysis for screen,

microphone technique, filmmaking training and storyboard.

Teaching and learning methods: The workshops will take the form of individual

acting exercises alongside appropriate technical training for independent filming, with

tutor facilitation and peer review at key developmental stages.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Working in groups, students create a showreel filmed on

location, which they independently produce.

The short film tests the students' creative and technical performance ability, as well

as their independent ability to create their own showreel work, as is expected within

the industry.

Formative feedback will be given throughout the process with tutors identifying how

to improve work-in-progress at points of intervention.

The resit assessment will match the first sit.

All marks awarded are individual marks.
