students on this module will be expected to use a range of resources including those

which are specialised or advanced within their field of study/practice, to critically

review evidence supporting conclusions and recommendations.

The aim of this module is to provide students with an opportunity to display a high

degree of autonomy through the management and production of an extended piece

of individual work at level three of their undergraduate studies.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: This module will consist of an introductory lecture prior to commencement of the placement year so that students have a good understanding of the requirements of the module, the resources available, the relationships between the employer, the university and the student and the information systems that will be utilised. As the module will be undertaken whilst on placement or in the workplace (if on the part time routeway) the module will be supported by online learning materials and the libraries research skills resources.

The module will be structured and materials provided to enable the students to become autonomous learners. PowerPoint/Panapto videos will support the module enabling students to engage with the materials on demand. Sessions will be delivered to help the students identify suitable individual studies, development of their study, researching library and company databases, presenting their work and development of their final report.

Students will be assigned both an academic tutor/supervisor. The role of the latter will be to provide support to the student regarding the choice of topic and its relevance to the workplace experience and to advise regarding workplace sources of information, data and their confidentiality and to authenticate that the work undertaken is that of the student.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: The assessment strategy has been designed to support the

student in developing good practice approaches in relation to professional practice

and development.

Assessment:

Task 1 PRESENTATION 25% (pre-recorded 8 ½ minutes)

The description of the project will be assessed by a PowerPoint presentation with

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imbedded audio-video so the student can make the most effective use of project information. It will also support the development of communications skills which are an essential element of an individual's personal development.

Task 2 – PORTFOLIO Report + Competency log 75% (2,000-words)

The written report provides evidence that the student can produce a critical analytical study relating the underpinning body of knowledge to their chosen study, supported by appropriate evidence of case study(s) to draw substantiated recommendations. The student will also be required to reflect on their workplace experience in the context of their individual professional field and reflect on their individual personal development using the competency frameworks of their chosen profession. This section of the report will also include a professional Mentor's/Supervisor's observation that assesses the student's work-based skills on a threshold basis. A satisfactory Report provides evidence of engagement in the placement year in a professional capacity and will signify a 'Sandwich' routeway on the student's record.
