Part 2: Description

Overview: The module will allow students the opportunity to question, understand and analyse the issues in the criminal justice system of England and Wales.

Outline syllabus: An indicative syllabus outline would include: Introduction – Both to the course and to the nature of criminal justice Purpose and values of criminal justice. Police Powers Regulation of the Investigative Stage Right to Silence Sentencing & Appeals The Domestic Court Setting Miscarriages of Justice Abuse of Police Powers and (a lack of) accountability. **Understanding Punishment** Prisons Non-Custodial Punishment(s)

It is not necessarily envisaged that every topic in the syllabus will be covered in any one academic year. Areas which have topical significance could, therefore, be developed at greater length and less topical areas dealt with in outline only.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: 72 hours made up of lectures, and workshops. There will also be 2 Revision sessions in each teaching block.

The workshop-based approach to teaching and learning is designed to enable the student to develop the independent research and analytical skills required for successful completion of a Level 3 Module.

The content of the course will take full account of issues relating to equality, diversity and inclusion, in line with the strategic directive of UWE.

Scheduled Learning:

Lectorial: Outline learning materials will be supplied to students in advance of the lectorial. Guest speakers will be utilised where appropriate.

Workshops: Workshops will involve problem-solving and the analysis and synthesis of conceptual and contextual issues, through group work, plenary discussion and debate, utilising technology.

Directed reading will be outlined along with a diverse range of sources, as appropriate. Students are expected to make full use of their independent learning time to reflect critically upon the subject and to develop their own ideas.
