additional moral responsibilities held by the profession.

Outline syllabus: The module covers the Core Duties applicable to barristers and

the accompanying raft of rules and guidance, which govern their professional

conduct. The module considers the ethical conduct and procedural protocols to be

adopted in situations of difficulty and the subjects and themes explored are taken

from the Bar Standards Board Handbook, which is the core text for this module.

involving the discussion of pre-prepared questions and unseen exam-style

questions; face-to-face and on line lectures and on line exam-style questions.
