Outline syllabus: The course will develop a theoretical understanding of narrative

structure, focusing on the changing representation of war and its aftermath; the

effects of commodification on everyday life; the city as a spectacle and location of

commodity aesthetics; the acknowledgment of, and resistance to, regional change,

and the reaction of marginalised voices to increased consumerism. Students will

explore these issues through a variety of mediums, including filmic adaptations of

literary texts and visual representations of the contemporary American scene.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: There will be a total of 72 contact hours for each

student over the course of the module. Teaching will take place in rooms designed

for interactive activities including group work.

Scheduled learning will take place through lectures, workshops and seminars.

The delivery will include technical training in tools such as Adobe Desktop Publishing

and the Photoshop suite
