Part 2: Description

Overview: This module provides an essential introduction to the structural characteristics of English and other languages.

Features: Not applicable

Educational aims: Students will be introduced to the fundamentals of morphology, syntax, language typology, phonetics and phonology. The module includes practical exercises, working with language data and exploring linguistic fieldwork. Students

will learn how to carry out analyses for specific grammatical structures and speech sounds, and gain a general understanding of how languages of the world compare at the structural level.

Outline syllabus: Topics likely to be covered include: an introduction to morphology; separating words into morphemes; morphological analyses of English and diverse other languages; an introduction to syntax; simple and complex sentences, finiteness and phrases; linguistic typology and differences across world languages; phonetics and phonology.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: Teaching and learning will be delivered through a combination of lecture, workshop, seminar, and tutorial formats, as appropriate. Student learning will also be supported by the university's VLE, where teaching slides, reading lists, weekly preparation, discussion boards and lecture recordings are hosted. Students will also be able to access assessment briefs from the start of teaching and will be offered bespoke assessment advice during scheduled teaching time. In addition, students will have regular opportunities to discuss their teaching and learning with the module teaching team, both in-person or online.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Assessment will be a set exercise in the form of a take-home question paper. This is designed to test various learning outcomes and areas of the module curriculum.

The set exercise will test students' understanding of various theoretical and analytical topics regarding English at the word level and, to a minor extent, the phrasal and sentence levels. Each question will test students' ability to perform specific analyses on a set of language data, and to provide solid reasoning for their choices in analysis.

Formative feedback: in advance of the final deadline, students will be offered assessment consultations to discuss key topics, and the opportunity to receive feedback on a practice exercise.

The resit assessment will match the first sit.
