Part 2: Description

Overview: Cognitive Neuropsychology is a branch of cognitive psychology, which is the scientific study of brain/behaviour relationships with a focus on cognitive abilities (e.g., perception, attention, memory, language, executive functions, etc). This module will review brain-behaviour interactions obtained from studies of human brain damage and from investigations of the typical brain.

Educational aims: This module aims to develop students' knowledge and understanding of brain/behaviour relationships and how to apply that knowledge in health, clinical and research settings.

Outline syllabus: The syllabus will typically include:

Methods of investigating brain/behaviour relationships, Neuropsychological Assessment, Visual, Auditory and Motor Movement, Ageing, Traumatic Brain Injury, Consciousness, Neurorehabilitation, Artificial Intelligence.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: Scheduled learning will take a variety of forms, such as lectures, seminars, workshops, and online materials. Independent learning includes essential and further reading, assignment preparation and completion, etc.

The focus of the module is on students engaging with course materials, learning actively, and generating their own areas of interest for further work.

Students will be enabled to use the university supported virtual learning environment (VLE) to organise and communicate their learning material. Students will be able to engage with the material, other students and members of staff through this system and make use of the various functionalities built into the VLE.

Part 4: Assessment

Assessment strategy: Summative assessment:

A portfolio assessment which consists of two tasks.

Task 1: A presentation (10 minutes maximum)

Task 2: Engagement activities that will consist of short answer questions each week for the first 8-10 weeks of the term, based on the previous week's content, discussion and readings. This will allow students to demonstrate a benchmark understanding of the foundations and encourage them to keep up-to-date with the module content, as well as providing regular opportunities for feedback on their learning.

Students must demonstrate a level of understanding of core topics in neuropsychology. It is the intention of this module to engage students in current research and debates within the field of neuropsychology through the presentation and short-answer questions. Presentations will provide students with the ability to evidence, apply, and reflect on neuropsychological knowledge and approaches to a specific question/scenario. Presentations are expected to draw on current and previous research literature in order to critically evaluate the subject matter presented.

The exact content of the Portfolio may vary year on year but the assessment

requirements, weighting between assessment tasks, as well as marking criteria will be clearly stated in the module handbook. The content of the portfolio in its entirety is equivalent to 2000 words of written work (maximum).

Formative feedback is embedded within teaching sessions with specific time allocated for assessment support.
