Educational aims: This module is designed to “twin” with the Social Sciences Placement Year and provides students who studied this course, who are enrolled on a Sociology programme to further consider and critically analyse a topic which

speaks to their experiences on the Placement Year and/ or their Sociological interests.

Outline syllabus: During the initial phase of the study the focus will be on identifying a topic area of interest, relevance and value to the student and then developing a plan, strategy and study programme relevant to the chosen area that supports the programme aims and module learning outcomes. Students will be supported by the module leader, or other member of academic staff to follow a systematic and organised route of enquiry and study and in doing so produce a critical and reflective essay for assessment.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: This will primarily develop key graduate attributes such as independent learning, written communication skills, creativity and innovation. Students are therefore expected to identify most of the reading relevant to their topic for themselves and will be encouraged to make full use of the print and electronic resources available to them through membership of the university. The student will be supported to develop skills through relevant scheduled learning on other modules, the provision of directed study time, for example 1-1 Tutorials, alongside email support and discussion groups, virtual learning environments (VLEs), other technology aided means and access to support from professional services such as the Library. As such contact time may vary, but a minimum of 6 hours should be expected.

Module Learning outcomes: On successful completion of this module students will achieve the following learning outcomes.

MO1 Apply and evaluate a range of theories related to the knowledge base of an aspect of practice from the placement and/or an area of sociological interest identified for exploration

MO2 Gather, organise and pursue empirical evidence in relation to the practice of the placement or an area of Sociological interest

MO3 Critically engage with debates in relation to ways in which their own practice might be enhanced, improved or maintained and demonstrate ways in which this might be generalised to the benefit of a of research work in the area that is being analysed

MO4 Evaluate student's own practice whilst reflecting either on the participation in the practice of work or in the analysis of the area of sociological interest

MO5 Demonstrate transferable skills necessary for study, Higher Education and future employment such as independent study, evaluative skills, communicating and understanding a complex and evidenced argument, reflexivity in critical analysis of the topic area, writing skills.
