Overview: This module will build upon the knowledge and skills acquired from the level 4 module, Occupational Competencies: Policing Conduct and Investigations and level 5 module, Occupational Competencies: Professional Policing.

Educational aims: Using aspects of the apprentices Occupational Competency Portfolio (OCP) the module will broadly focus on addressing identified areas of

strength and weakness for each apprentice and to support continued knowledge development by focusing on relevant legislation and professional standards.

Outline syllabus: This module will combine learning and development in a number of key policing competencies.

To help achieve this apprentices will continue to learn about and gain experience in the five strands of professional police practice set out by the College of Policing. This entails the structure and purpose of responding to calls for service (response policing); policing communities; policing the roads; how to use information and intelligence; and how to conduct criminal investigations.
