Outline syllabus: Reflecting that enquiry and exploration are at the heart of the Future Nurse curriculum so that as nurses of the future students are able to influence and contribute to processes of organisational change through a critical understanding and awareness of local and national policies. This module focuses on primary healthcare exploring the complexities and implications of autonomous working in primary and community care.
