STUDENT AND ACADEMIC SERVICES

There are 21 contact hours assigned to this module.

Scheduled learning may include a combination of face to face and online lectures, seminars, tutorials and project supervision – individually and in groups. Students are expected to initiate contact with their supervisor to request supervision at a mutually convenient time, during the module run.

Independent learning includes hours engaged with essential reading, assignment preparation and completion etc. These sessions constitute an average time per level as indicated in the table below.

Part 3: Assessment

This is a Project Module and is assessed primarily through a written Investigative Project. The student will engage in investigation of a topic related to their chosen professional pathway and will utilise basic skills of exploring and scoping a topic under supervision. The student is expected to undertake data collection demonstrating adherence to ethical aspects where appropriate.

Included in this is a 500 word Extract from Research Journal. This allows the student to reflect on what is being learned and how this develops the student's thinking.

Apart from the summative assessment, the student will have the opportunity of an informal short verbal presentation on their topic which will allow for feedback from peers and staff – thus helping them to further scope and/or focus their investigation.
