Part 2: Description

You will be taught how to accurately measure actors for the purpose of constructing and fitting costumes. From these measurements you will then draft the blocks required, including ladies' bodice, trouser, sleeve, skirt etc. You will be required to produce patterns and make up basic garments including drafting, fitting and completing a personal corset project. You will also be taught how to carry out fittings of these garments and make suitable alterations. You will be expected to create samples of processes, fastenings and specific period details for example lacing and cartridge pleats. You will also construct basic period garments for example petticoats, shirts and bloomers. You will be taught the appropriate methods of draping fabric on a stand and will produce samples of this technique.

Teaching will be delivered through project and class work including a high ratio of one to one teaching with the Costume making tutor and visiting tutors. You will learn fitting procedure and etiquette through attending fittings.

The majority of scheduled learning in this module is delivered through demonstration, practical classes and workshops, work based learning and supervised time in studio/workshop. Independent learning includes the production of a cohesive set of samples for future reference and completion of a full range of paper blocks and a range of foundation wear samples.
