Contact Hours/Scheduled Hours	The module will be delivered through three contact hours per week. The module will operate through workshop/practical exercises and self-directed independent study/research according to the nature of the material being explored.			
Teaching and Learning Methods	Scheduled learning The module will operate through workshops. These may include practical theatre work, rehearsals and seminar-style discussions. Students will be expected to devote additional time outside scheduled sessions to researching and preparing materials for their Performances and critical Commentary and Evaluation submissions. They will also be expected to research, devise, write, rehearse, perform and operate multimedia equipment as required throughout the module, for which full support is given.			
	Independent learning Each student is expected to engage with weekly independent research/rehearsal that will inform practical work throughout each semester. This includes DVD and audio material via electronic resources.			
Reading Strategy*	Essential reading There will be one essential anthology purchase at the beginning of Semester One. For Semester Two, key chapters from other sources will be available electronically via UWE Online or as a printed study pack. Students are expected to identify all other reading relevant to their chosen topic for themselves. They will be encouraged to read widely using the library catalogue, a variety of bibliographic and full text databases, and Internet resources. It will be expected that assignment bibliographies and reference lists will reflect the range of reading carried out. The development of literature searching skills is supported by the Library seminar within the Level 3 module Z. Additional support is available through UWEonline. This includes interactive tutorials on search skills and on the use of specific electronic library resources. Sign up workshops are also offered by the Library.
