## Part 2: Description

This module considers the origins and development of the English Language and explores some 'big questions' about what language is, what it is used for, what it tells us about the mind and what it tells us about our society. At the end of the module students should have an understanding of what the study of language entails, have been introduced to a variety of sub-disciplines of linguistics and generally have a strong foundation for future study in this field. In addition, students will gain the necessary study skills for degree-level study.

## Part 3: Assessment

In TB1, students will be assessed by way of a multiple-choice examination covering the broad topics outlined. In addition, students will write a 750-word piece which reports in an accessible way on one of

the language-related topics introduced in class or which the student has encountered in the course of their independent study. In TB2, students take a short in-class test relating to the history and development of English. They also write a 1,000-word academic essay.
