Part 2: Description

Educational Aims: This module is designed to allow the student to develop their musical abilities in musical composition, the analysis of and aural appreciation of a wide range of contemporary music.

Outline Syllabus: Students will be expected to write their own compositions and to present them to a professional standard in the form of written scores and in some cases as recordings.

The development of contemporary compositional techniques in the Twentieth Century and beyond

Core contemporary repertoire of the Twentieth Century to today

Orchestration

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Typesetting

The compositional process

Free composition

Teaching and Learning Methods: The module will be delivered through a mix of lectures, seminars, tutorials and workshops with professional performers, designed to suit both current learning approaches and a wider range of modes of attendance and distance learning.

Lectures will provide the technical, organisational and theoretical concepts and general background to the key issues of the module.

Seminars and small-group tutorials will run alongside lecture content, supporting and informing the assessment of the module wherever possible and also providing a platform for the student to demonstrate and regularly discuss their developing skills in composition and analysis.

Working towards the key aims and objectives of this module may involve work outside university core hours.
