Outline syllabus: Semester 1: Practical sessions will encourage learning through play, improvisation and imaginative exercise work. This semester will end with ten-

minute performance pieces (undertaken in groups).

Semester 2: Workshop sessions will continue to develop a practical and theoretical understanding of textual analysis and the development of character. This semester will end with a devised ten-minute group performance.

Part 3: Teaching and learning methods

Teaching and learning methods: The module will be delivered through three contact hours per week. The module will operate through a combination of seminars, lectures, workshop/practical exercises and self-directed groups according to the nature of the material being studied.

Scheduled learning

The module will operate through workshops. These may include practical theatre work, rehearsals and seminar-style discussions. Students will be expected to devote additional time outside scheduled sessions to researching and preparing materials for class and assessment.

Engagement is a student's preparedness for and participation in class-related learning activities. The preparations include rehearsal, primary and critical reading of a variety of texts (printed, online, screen media etc.), ongoing project work, and the generation of works-in-progress.

Independent learning

Each student is expected to engage with weekly independent research/rehearsal that will inform practical work throughout each semester. This may include DVD and audio material via electronic resources.

Module Learning outcomes: On successful completion of this module students will achieve the following learning outcomes.

MO1 An understanding of the way in which the body is used to communicate ideas, emotion and the environment within performance

MO2 The ability to create character through textual analysis

MO3 An understanding of affective memory and other applied techniques relating to actor training and the self

MO4 A practical awareness of the importance of concentration and control in the stage presence of the actor

MO5 The ability to create a devised performance using improvisation and independent research
