Part 2: Description

Overview: Pre-requisites: students must take one out of UARAEM-30-1 Introduction to Creative Writing or UARPDB-30-1 Introduction to Performance: Texta and Contexts or UARANY-30-1 Introduction to Actor Training

Educational Aims: See Learning Outcomes

Outline Syllabus: The content of this module will vary according to the specific interests of individuals and student groups.

The finished piece of work will take the form of either an individual dissertation or a group performance.

Students intending to graduate on BA (Hons) Drama with Technical Theatre will be instructed and supported in technical elements of production for the group performance (not dissertation).

Students intending to graduate on BA (Hons) Drama with Theatre Directing will be instructed and supported in directing the production for group performance (not dissertation).

Therefore, the facilitation of the student's project (in terms of managing expectations and abilities, suggesting research, giving feedback and advising on the development of work) forms the structure of the project's process.

Teaching and Learning Methods: Scheduled Learning

There will be weekly taught sessions where participation from students is required. We will focus on generating an appropriate topic, research skills, the development of the project and the project's preparation for submission. Students will evaluate their own and their peers' work in the safe environment of classroom discussions.

Independent Learning

Students will be expected to invest substantial time outside of scheduled classes to research and generate their project. This module facilitates students' learning and therefore the majority of the material is generated by the student.

The module will be delivered through three contact hours per week. The module will operate through a combination of seminars, lectures, workshop/practical exercises and self-directed groups according to the nature of the material being studied.

Part 3: Assessment

This is a project Module and therefore has only one component of assessment.

It is made up of three assessed elements:

Critical engagement with practice in classes. Critical Engagement is a student's preparedness for and participation in class-related learning activities. The preparations include rehearsal, primary and critical reading of a variety of texts (printed, online, screen media etc.), ongoing project work, writing exercises, and the generation of works-in-progress (10%).

A progress report (given verbally, 7 mins) (15%).

The final project work (75%).

All assessments are given individual marks.

The assessment criteria for each element are available to students in electronic handbooks and via Blackboard at

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the beginning of the academic year. The criteria are module specific and aligned with the learning outcomes for the module.

Feedback is given in written form according to these criteria. For Referral runs of this Module: project material that has been re-worked from the First Sit is permissible for submission in the Resit.
