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Outline syllabus: This module introduces several of the most notable (and

notorious) contemporary British and American plays. 'Contemporary' is here largely

defined as plays written since 1990, although earlier work may be read as part of the

module. Drama from both countries will be studied simultaneously and in terms of

the dramatization of a number of themes, such as global politics, race, class, and

violence. Particular attention will be paid to each play's form (such as realism, satire,

state of the nation, or docudrama), as well its relation to the differing dramatic

traditions of both countries.

Teaching and learning methods: This module will contain a lecture and seminar

format, although there will be the opportunity in seminars to explore texts with

regards to their performance potential. The Module will be delivered through 3

contact hours per week.
