Part 2: Description

The first part of the module is designed to introduce students to the nature of the university study of English, and more specifically: to equip them with close-reading techniques; to increase their technical vocabulary in areas such as prosody and narrative; and to establish some of the fundamentals of good scholarly practice in terms of research, presentation, analysis, construction of argument, citation, etc. The lectures and seminars will primarily address these issues in the context of the study of individual literary texts, with the seminars focusing on close reading, and the workshops offering opportunities to apply these skills through practical exercises. Both seminars and workshops will comprise an ongoing element of formative assessment by staff and student peers, and these skills will also be formally assessed through the Close-Reading Log and Exam. The students will also be introduced to the use of the library and given training in using resources, including e-databases.

In the second part of the module students will broaden their view of texts to encompass a more sophisticated understanding of concepts such as influence, canonicity, periodization and literary 'movements'. They will be encouraged to go beyond close reading and to develop ways of participating in the 'critical conversation', both through conventional academic argument and through other forms such as evaluative reviews and creative writing. The module will address the relationship between critical and creative approaches to understanding and expression.

Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

Component A

The exam will use practical exercises to test students on some the fundamental technical skills and vocabulary involved in critical reading, writing and research, and may include such items as summarizing a critical passage, and providing a close reading of an extract from one of the set texts on the module.

Component B

- 1) The Close-Reading Log consists of three 500-word analyses of short texts studied in the early weeks of the module. This aims to focus students' attention on close textual analysis and clarity and precision of expression. Because the writing takes place over several weeks, it allows for several opportunities for continuous diagnostic assessment and formative feedback from both tutor and peers. In the portfolio, students are assessed on their accurate use of technical language, their understanding of the literary texts they are discussing, and the clarity and precision of their writing.
- The Critical-Creative Portfolio may include: a) a short academic essay on a text studied on the module; b) a piece of creative writing with commentary; c) (optionally) a critical review of a film/television/theatre adaptation.
