### Part 2: Description

The confidence and ability to think critically, apply knowledge and skills, and provide expert, evidence-based, nursing care lies at the centre of nursing practice, this module is one of a suite of choice modules that have been development to offer nursing students in their final year of their studies choice so that are empowered to consider long term career pathways prior to registration. Each of the choice module has been aligned to existing and emerging models of care. Reflecting that enquiry and exploration are at the heart of the Future Nurse curriculum so that as nurses of the future students are able to influence and contribute to processes of organisational change through an awareness of local and national policies

This module focuses on the biopsychosocial impact of cancer on those diagnosed with cancer

The learning and teaching methods of the module will combine interactive simulations based within classrooms and simulated care settings, and structured self-directed learning sessions using Blackboard (VLE) and other on-line and taught materials. The teaching and content will be delivered by academic and practitioners from across the four fields of nursing.

#### Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The assessment strategy for this module is designed to allow a diverse range of students to be able to critically explore and analyse their own current and future practice focusing on an existing or emerging model of care.

**Formative assessment**: Students will be given the opportunity to present and discuss assignment plans at a seminar within the module.

**Summative assessment**: This module is summatively assessed through a 2,000 word assignment to enable students to evaluate the evidence in relation to one aspect of provision relating to person-centred care in the community.

The assessment is the submission of a 2000 word essay addressing a cancer related topic linking to their clinical experience. The assignment will enable students some flexibility to reflect their own interest and learning within guidelines and guidelines will signpost what should be included in order to demonstrate achievement of the module learning outcomes.
