In the UK, it is estimated that around 850,000 people have dementia. <p>The learning and teaching methods of the module will combine interactive simulations based within classrooms and simulated care settings, and structured self-directed learning sessions using Blackboard (VLE) and other on-line and taught materials. The teaching and content will be delivered by academic and practitioners from across the four fields of nursing.</p> |
