<p><b>Overview:</b> In this module you will examine the care of an adult with a cardiac condition from assessment to management. You will consider the pathophysiology related to the cardiac condition and review policy. <p>Formative assessment: Students will be given opportunities through reflection on practice, group discussion forum and with feedback throughout the module, to discuss ideas related to their specific area of cardiac care.</p> <p>Summative assessment: Written assignment 3000 words At level 3 students are expected to evaluate current research evidence and apply this to the delivery of evidence based cardiac care. This should include an exploration of literature and discuss the current issues in a chosen area of cardiac care. The assignment will enable students to produce a paper that addresses contemporary issues in cardiac care and considers the journey from assessment through to management.</p>
