Assessment strategy: Task 1 (40% of module mark) will be based on a 1800 word

coursework which will assess students' knowledge, understanding and powers of

critical analysis in relation to topics covered in the first semester.

Task 2 (60% of module mark) 2500 word coursework. Written answer on a problem

or essay style question or case commentary. This will assess students' knowledge,

understanding and powers of critical analysis in relation to topics covered in the

second semester. Moreover, it will enable them to show their mastery of research

technique and the ability to synthesise the results of that research.

The workshops will enable formative assessment to take place in the form of

activities based on problem scenarios, essays, and case commentaries.
