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Part 3: Assessment			
Assessment Strategy	There are two components of assessment:		
	Successful completion of elements 1, 2 and 3 is required to pass component A.		
	<b>Component A</b> comprises of 3 elements to meet the requirements of the Nurse Diploma of the Faculty of Sexual and Reproductive Healthcare (NDFSRH).		
	Element 1: Electronic knowledge assessment (e-KA) of sexual and reproductive healthcare (assessment duration 1hr 45mins). In order to pass this element the students are required to engage with and complete the e-learning requirements specified by the FSRH.		
	Element 2: Faculty of Sexual and Reproductive Health (FSRH) Course of Five. This involves 5 hours of workshops and a combination of oral and practical assessments to demonstrate the students' application of knowledge to practice. This is assessed by a Faculty registered trainer under controlled conditions.		
	Element 3: FSRH Clinical Experience and Assessment (e-portfolio). Preparation and support for this element of assessment will be provided by a mentor in clinical practice and a UWE Practice Educator. The summative assessment of competency must be signed off by a Faculty registered trainer.		

Component B comprises of 1 element.
Element 1: A 1,500 word reflective account of learning. The student will be required to reflect on their learning and professional development through the use of a reflective framework.
This will be marked with reference to specific criteria which is available in the module handbook and in line with UWE Academic Regulations and Procedures.
