Reflecting that enquiry and exploration are at the heart of the Future Nurse curriculum so that as nurses of the future students are able to influence and contribute to processes of organisational change through an awareness of local and national policies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> This module focuses on Dementia as number of people estimated to be living with dementia globally is 44 million, and it is thought that this number will double by 2030. In the UK, it is estimated that around 850,000 people have dementia. <p>The learning and teaching methods of the module will combine interactive simulations based within classrooms and simulated care settings, and structured self-directed learning sessions using Blackboard (VLE) and other on-line and taught materials. The teaching and content will be delivered by academic and practitioners from across the four fields of nursing.</p>
