Part 2: Description

The confidence and ability to think critically, apply knowledge and skills, and provide expert, evidence-based, nursing care lies at the centre of nursing practice. This module offers final year nursing students to consider long term career pathways prior to registration. Reflecting that enquiry and exploration are at the heart of the Future Nurse curriculum, this module has a particular focus on approaches to pain management and the role of the nurse in influencing and contributing to the processes of organisational change in improving care delivery for individuals in apin management. through an awareness of national and international policies

This module will use a range of learning and teaching strategies to support student learning and will include:

- Lectures
- Scenario based teaching through interaction
- Group work
- Self-directed learning
- Digital learning delivered through Blackboard and other virtual learning platforms

Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The assessment strategy for this module is designed to allow a diverse range of students to be able to explore their own current and future practice focusing on an existing and or emerging model of care.

Formative assessment: Students are given the opportunity to produce a draft plan and will have peer critiques and feedback facilitated by the module team.

Summative assessment: This assignment is by way of a poster presentation analysing the effectiveness of pain management nationally and internationally and how this impacts on pain management interventions. Poster should include:

- Statistical data outlining the issues within pain management in care delivery giving a national and international perspective
- Themes derived from the literature and how this impacts on current nursing care of pain management
- Policies that support pain management including legal and ethical aspects of care delivery
- Pain management interventions utilised supported with evidence of the effectiveness
- Recommendations for the future
