Part 2: Description

The aim of this module is to capture learning that the student has undertaken as part of a study abroad exchange, but which cannot be formally recognised as part of a pre-existing credit-bearing module (either here at UWE or at a partner-exchange institution). Primarily, but not exclusively, this would apply to a single semester study abroad exchange where the student studies one semester of a two semester module ('partner' module).

The module captures the learning achieved as part of an approved study abroad exchange the content of which has been negotiated and agreed with the programme leader in advance. A portfolio of assessment that aligns to the study undertaken and the learning outcomes of the programme is agreed in advance.

Students will attend the relevant timetabled content and support aligned to the partner module, and prepare and submit the agreed portfolio of assessment.

This module is available to incoming study abroad exchange students and to UWE students taking part in a single semester study abroad exchange.

Part 3: Assessment

- Portfolio
- The student will undertake a pre-agreed individual portfolio of work to capture learning and development achieved.
- The portfolio should be distinct from any other Independent Study module portfolio being undertaken.
- The portfolio should be equivalent to 3000 words and may comprise one or more parts to demonstrate the learning outcomes, as agreed in advance with the programme leader.

Students will attend the relevant timetabled content and support aligned to the partner module, and prepare and submit the agreed portfolio of assessment.

Appropriate guidance and formative feedback will be provided in line with the student's level of study and prior experience.
