Part 2: Description

On successful completion of this module the trainee nursing associates will be able to communicate effectively across a wide range of channels and with a wide range of individuals, the public, Health and Social Care Professionals, maintain the focus of communication on delivering and improving health and care services and will possess those inter-personal skills that promote clarity, compassion, empathy, respect and trust (NHS HEE 2016)

This module will enable an individual to develop a range of interpersonal skills whilst considering both verbal and nonverbal communication across a range of client groups, and health care professionals. In addition, this module will enable the development of a repertoire of skills, which support the promotion of clear and effective communication. Barriers to communication will also be considered and strategies developed to resolve potential issues. For example how a client's/patients clinical presentation may affect verbal and non-verbal communication.

Record keeping is an integral part of nursing practice and this module will consider the importance of accurate recording, reporting and secure storing of information and data to maintain confidentiality and in light with organisational and national data protection policies.
