## Part 2: Description

Overview: Following on from the conclusion of the previous module 'Consolidating Practices I, students will have evidenced either continuation or exit strategies based on their findings and body of work. Based on these strategies and in negotiation with their tutor, students will either start a new body of work or continue their current research interests and practical work. The new or continuing work will demonstrate their ability as an innovative and creative visual communicator, capable of creating meaningful and interesting content. The negotiated content of the work should reflect on the creative identity and direction of the visual work produced up to this point.

**Educational Aims:** Through a series of seminars, lectures and tutorials, students refine their creative, professional and critical positions.

**Outline Syllabus:** The body of practical work is complemented by an evaluation report. This will discuss the rationale behind the research and practical work undertaken; the relevance of the work to the student's intentions beyond the programme; the location of the work in relation to contemporary and historical practice in the subject; the broader creative cultural and social contexts; and potential modes and methods of dissemination that they will undertake in the following module. They will consider the extent to which knowledge, understanding and working methods have developed and the extent to which their intentions have been effectively realised through their practice and research.

The module allows for 72 hours scheduled contact time.

**Teaching and Learning Methods:** This module will be delivered through lectures, seminars, group and individual tutorials, as well as online materials via Blackboard/myUWE. Lectures and presentations by guest speakers will be used to present an overview of working practices and contemporary themes in photography and together with the set reading will suggest a range of perspectives and methods that the students can use. Interim Project Reviews will allow students to demonstrate and present their ongoing project at key points within the module cycle, to gain feedback, assess progress and where appropriate revise schedules and appropriate methods.

Scheduled learning includes lectures, seminars, tutorials, project supervision, practical classes and workshops; external visits; work based learning; supervised time in studio/workshop.

Independent learning includes hours engaged with essential reading, case study preparation, assignment preparation and completion etc.

### Part 3: Assessment

Practical project work forms the basis of the interim project reviews that include formative feedback. Students also receive formative feedback through individual and group tutorials.

Summative assessment is made of the work at the end of the module, as follows: critical reflection on their body of practical work in relation to their original intention is evidenced within the Evaluation Report and submitted for assessment along with the practical body of work.

Component A, Element 1: Body of work (100%)

A body of practical work with accompanying supporting research materials, and an Evaluative Report (1,500 words) evidencing critical reflection on their body of practical work and their preliminary proposal.

Assessment Criteria:

Students will be assessed on the following:

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Assessment Criteria: the level of creativity and innovation demonstrated in the development and presentation of a body work.
