Part 2: Description

This module will, upon successful completion, allow midwives to practice as professional midwifery advocates. Theoretical and practical learning will center of the four elements of the A-EQUIP model

- · Monitoring, evaluation and quality control
- · Clinical supervision (restorative)
- · Personal action for quality improvement
- · Education and development

Part 3: Assessment

The assessment strategy for this module will be supported by formative and summative review points and will ensure the midwife has developed the necessary variety of skills, at the appropriate standard, to be a professional midwifery advocate (PMA).

Formative Assessment

Formative assessment includes: -

- An initial, interim and end of placement learning review
- A reflective account focussing on an area of midwifery practice that is enhanced by the PMA, with a focus on how the midwife has developed and applied their knowledge to the A-EQUIP model.

Summative Assessment

Component A: Completion of practice competencies

The midwife is required to attain all the practice competencies in the practice document signed off (by his/her mentor). These practice competencies are marked as pass /fail. The midwife will be allocated a PMA mentor from the practice area, who will meet with them at regular intervals to discuss learning opportunities, allowing them to meet the proficiencies. The one to one meetings will also allow them to discuss and reflect with them the activities they have undertaken.

Component B

Element 1: Presentation

In his/her role as a PMA, the midwife is required to be able to communicate and present information and ideas in a concise and articulate manner. This requirement supports the rationale for a presentation as part of the assessment and the supporting paper. The weighting of the presentation assessment (50%) reflects the importance placed on the PMA's ability to articulate his/her topic demonstrating his/her aptitude to critically discuss elements of the topic selected related to enhancing midwifery practice.

Element 2: Supporting paper

The expectation from the supporting paper is to allow the midwife to further evaluate and elaborate on the presentation topic, whilst demonstrating a thorough knowledge and understanding how the A-EQUIP model and the PMA role can be effectively utilised to enhance midwifery care. The supporting paper will account for 50% of the allocated marks.

Formative feedback is not given within 10 working days of the module summative assessment date.

Part 4: Teaching and Learning Methods

Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this module students will be able to:

- Demonstrate deep understanding of NMC statutory, regulatory frameworks, showing critical judgement and a systematic approach when interpreting and applying the NMC Code (2015), and the requirements for revalidation (NMC 2015a), to support midwives to consider their practice. (Component A and B)
- 2. Critically review and interpret the impact of national and local policies, guidelines, recommendations, quality indicators and evidence on the provision of maternity services, and identify strategies to support midwives to develop their practice accordingly (Component A and B)
- 3. Critically appraise the role of a Professional Midwifery Advocate and the A-Equip model in creating an environment for learning and cultural change in the service, organisation and profession and for opportunities to develop transformative care for women. (Component A and B)
- 4. Critically evaluate the complex, ethical, legal and professional issues that impact upon maternity care and the provision of clinical supervision, and demonstrate strategies to support midwives in relation to this (Component B)
- 5. Demonstrate originality in influencing, leading and evaluating service development and transformation, at a strategic level, which promotes a safe, evidence-based, collaborative, proactive, user-led service (component B).
- 6. Demonstrate accountability and positive role modelling through reflection on personal learning, leadership, advocacy, autonomous decision-making and active contribution to assurance and quality improvement (Component A and B)
- 7. Critically evaluate models of supervision and other enablers that optimise the supervisor / supervisee relationship to promote and assure: colleagues' understanding of personal accountability and responsibility; well-being and personal safety; and management of conflict and distress (Component A and B)
- 8. Achieve a passing grade in the competencies set out in the operational guidance (DH 2017) (Component A)
