Part 2: Description

This module is designed to help students understand the expectations of study in higher education and to introduce them to the academic and study skills required for success on their chosen subject pathway. The module focuses on the core skills necessary to underpin the thematic modules, and aims to aid academic progression by developing the capacity and confidence for effective independent learning. Students' confidence in participating in work at this level will actively be addressed via weekly group and collaborative activities.

Content will be shaped indicatively on the following areas:

Component B Element 2

- Reading strategies for different purposes
- Research strategies: identifying, locating and retrieving information from a range of sources for different purposes
- Summarising, interpreting, analysing and evaluating information from a range of sources
- Note-making skills for reading and lectures
- Writing for different purposes
- Using appropriate academic conventions and style, referencing and avoiding plagiarism
- Oral presentation skills
- Using IT for academic purposes
- Exam skills
- Target setting, planning and time management for independent learning
- Teamwork skills and group collaboration
- · Reflecting on learning and progress in response to group discussion, formal and informal feedback

Part 3: Assessment: Strategy and Details

The assessment strategy is designed to support and enhance the development of core subject-specific and transferable study skills. Assessment is through individual coursework and group presentation projects tailored to complement learning on the other modules in the Foundation Year and support effective progression to undergraduate level.

Component A: Controlled Conditions 30%

Component A requires students to engage collaboratively in evidence-based learning and reflection related to a) their own chosen pathways (the presentation, Element 1) and b) the academic year as a whole (the creative project, Element 2). Students will bring together team work and communication, critical thinking and reflection skills, on these two projects.

Component B: Coursework 70%

In Component B, students work individually to demonstrate key skills for study in Higher Education. These include reading and engaging with academic texts, individual research, synthesising information, critical thinking, essay planning and academic writing skills in different genres.
