# Part 4: Assessment

**Assessment strategy:** The assessment strategy is designed to support and enhance the development of core subject-specific and transferable study skills. Assessment is through individual coursework and group presentation projects tailored to complement learning on the other modules in the Foundation Year and support effective progression to undergraduate level.

Component A: Controlled Conditions 30%

Component A requires students to engage collaboratively in evidence-based learning and reflection related to a) their own chosen pathways (the presentation, Element 1) and b) the academic year as a whole (the creative project, Element 2). Students will bring together team work and communication, critical thinking and reflection skills, on these two projects.

Component B: Coursework 70%

In Component B, students work individually to demonstrate key skills for study in Higher Education. These include reading and engaging with academic texts, individual research, synthesising information, critical thinking, essay planning and academic writing skills in different genres.
