Assessment strategy: The assessments help to develop students' wider

2 x 1500-word or equivalent essays/ reports/ creative pieces (50% each)

These coursework tasks allow students to develop a range of ideas and skills. The

individual elements will reflect the students' engagement with different aspects of

arts and humanities disciplines and will assess their understanding of core skills

including their ability to produce work to deadlines, respond to project briefs, work

independently, research and edit materials, produce clear, coherent, and rational

arguments and communicate these to an audience through a range of media. They

develop students' abilities to produce work in different genres such as the History

heritage report, creative writing and visual media like the photo and essay. For both

assignments, students will have a choice of topics and formats that relate to the

different subject areas covered by the Foundation Year.
