#### Part 2: Description

The student will negotiate an area of study relating to a pathway of their choice with the module tutor and develop a research project. The module will enable students to develop their skills, experience and knowledge, and develop and present an individual study.

This module is designed to allow the student to develop as an independent learner. Guidance will be given through individual and some group supervision sessions. The module will be introduced through a series of introductory sessions providing guidance on working independently.

In addition to the summative assessments, the student will present their developing work through informal short presentations at small group tutorials which will allow for feedback from peers and staff, enabling them to further scope and/or focus their investigation.

### Part 3: Assessment

Both Component A and B help to develop students' wider understanding of the programme and enable them to make informed decisions about future pathways.

### Component A

This component examines the students' ability to critically reflect, analyse, create content, edit, and deliver an oral presentation to a specified audience. Students will present their extended project to their peers, demonstrating good presentation skills.

### Component B

The Project develops students' research and investigative skills. Focusing on a topic of their own choosing, students will work with a supervisor and their peers to produce a coherent and detailed study of a relevant field within the arts and humanities.
