Part 2: Description

This module will build upon the skills and knowledge developed from the level 1 module, Craft Skills: A Foundation to enable apprentices to develop greater competency in a range of key policing skills as well as the academic knowledge that underpins them.

Apprentices will gain greater understanding and knowledge and skills related to topics including leadership and teamwork, communication skills, wellbeing and resilience, criminal justice and decision making and discretion.

During the module apprentices will learn how to apply the knowledge gained to their daily working roles to assist in their decision making practices. In addition, a continued focus on officer well-being and resilience will underpin this learning as well as a focus on ethics and ethical practice and decision making.

Finally, apprentices will continue to learn about partnership and multi-agency work within the criminal justice system as well as their responsibilities to offenders, victim and witness in the criminal justice process. Apprentices will be offered opportunities to develop a broader and more critical understanding of these identities and processes by engaging with these topics from differing sociological and criminological perspectives. This will compliment their own reflective practice and support them to think about the different ways people engage with the criminal justice system.

The module will comprise periods of intensive face to face and distance learning.

Summative assessment

Component A

Group work task encompassing team work and communications related to the Police And Community Together (PACT) context. This will require apprentices to work together to unpack a topic related to policing by consent as relevant to community forum.

Rationale: This will assess the underpinning theoretic aspects of the module relating to communication, team working and organisational culture as per the learning outcomes. This will allow apprentices to be assessed efficiently on their ability to apply knowledge in practice but also reflect on their own values and how police organisations are represented.

Component B

1500 word report on how apprentices own operational experiences of working with their team or colleagues, offenders, victims, witnesses and/or other agencies link to partnership for example in relation to rehabilitation eg. youth justice or restorative justice.

Rationale: This will enable apprentices to demonstrate their understanding of rehabilitation and partnerships in the criminal justice context.

Formative assessment: Apprentices will be able to engage in formative quizzes and review simulation training material throughout the module including using aspects on line learning from the College of Policing managed learning environment (MLE).
