Component A:




A 3000 word project critically analysing the impact of a policy on current practice.

This will allow students the opportunity to evaluate the implementation of a policy in detail, and critically analyse the impact on day to day care and services. Students will use this analysis to make recommendations regarding improvements in care and services.

Students studying this module will need to critically appraise policy issues and apply these in order to make appropriate recommendations for implementation for future care and services.

Students will have the opportunity for formative feedback through supervisory input, and peer group work.
